MEDIUM-TERM DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Water-Lily Foundation is proud to have been part of the MTDP Regional Workshop held in Tamale, which kicked off a series of Regional Youth Workshops and Consultations on Climate-Resilient Development Planning in March 2025. Representing the foundation were our dedicated Volunteer & Membership Coordinator, **Dogoli Fredrick**, and Operations & Partnership Officer, **Aminu Gafaru**.

This transformative workshop provided a platform for our team and other youth leaders to deepen their understanding of climate risks and vulnerability assessments, and how to leverage local government structures to shape policies that are climate-smart and sustainable.

A major highlight of the workshop was the profiling of the Northern Region through thematic areas including WASH, biodiversity, youth unemployment, gender, and vegetation, among others. These discussions helped identify pressing climate change issues unique to the region; issues that inspired meaningful dialogue and action-oriented thinking.

The workshop culminated in the development of a youth-led position paper, capturing the most urgent climate challenges and proposing solutions. This document will inform UNICEF Ghana's advocacy with national policymakers, ensuring youth voices are heard at the highest levels.

GHANA CIVIL SOCIETY FORUM 2025

In a strategic effort to fortify our networks and operational resilience, we contributed to the Ghana Civil Society Forum 2025. This major gathering, sponsored by a consortium of pivotal institutions like STAR-Ghana Foundation and Oxfam, focused on a vital sector-wide agenda: enhancing collaboration and devising sustainable models to survive funding constraints. Our involvement was key to aligning our strategies with national civil society efforts to safeguard long-term development impact.

UNIDO CIRCULAR ECONOMY TRAINER-OF-TRAINERS

We are proud to have been represented by **Abdul Samed Rafiatu**, our **Cybersecurity & Digital Transformation Manager**, at the prestigious UNIDO Trainer-of-Trainers Workshop on the Circular Economy held at La Palm Royal Beach Hotel, Accra.

This **two-day intensive session**, led by the UNIDO - United Nations Industrial Development Organization, the Ministry of Environment, Science and Technology (MEST), with funding from Canada's International Trade - Global Affairs Canada, was a powerhouse of **knowledge, strategy, and collaboration**. The insights gained into circular economy principles, practices, and capacity-building are invaluable.

This experience directly fuels our **CleanCycle Project** and equips us to better integrate circularity into the heart of our operations in Northern Ghana. We are now even more empowered to train, educate, and lead our communities in **creating value from waste and building a greener, more resilient economy**.

FINANCIAL INTEGRITY THROUGH STRONG AML/CFT MEASURES

Water Lily Foundation participated in a one-day capacity-building workshop, on Anti-Money Laundering and Combating the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) organized by the Ministry of Gender, Children and Social Protection, in collaboration with the Financial Intelligence Center (FIC).

The workshop, held on November 4, 2025, at the Nim Avenue Hotel in Tamale, aimed to enhance participants understanding of financial integrity and compliance within the non-profit sector.

During the session, participants were taken through key aspects of the Anti-Money Laundering Act and the Anti-Terrorism Act, as well as the stages and processes of money laundering and terrorism financing.

A major takeaway from the workshop was the importance of *knowing our donors and beneficiaries* to avoid any involvement in illegal financial activities. The NPO Secretariat also guided participants on the requirements and compliance expectations for Non-Profit and Civil Society Organizations.

OFFICE OF THE SPECIAL PROSECUTOR (OSP) LAW AND RELATED ANTI-CORRUPTION FRAMEWORKS

Organized by the Ghana Anti-Corruption Coalition (GACC) with support from GIZ.

The forum, held on November 5, 2025, at TDC in Tamale, emphasized the crucial role of organizations in combating corruption through practical measures. During the session, key discussions centered on the critical role of the OSP in investigating and prosecuting corruption cases, the necessity for collaboration among anti-corruption agencies like CHRAJ and EOCO, and the power of citizen vigilance and reporting. A major takeaway was the emphasis on how transparency and accountability are shared responsibilities, requiring active participation from public institutions, civil society, and every citizen to be effective.



Commitment to the Future


